He is a Board Certified Internist and former Clinical Service Chief of Internal Medicine with 10 years of experience providing comprehensive ambulatory and inpatient acute care for the Gallup Indian Medical Center, Navajo Service Unit Indian Health Service.

Dr. Ignace received his Master of Public Health in Health Care Management and Policy from the Harvard School of Public Health while completing the Commonwealth Fund/Harvard University Fellowship in Minority Health Policy in 2009-2010. A long standing member of the Association of American Indian Physicians (AAIP). He completed his Internal Medicine Residency Program at the Medical College of Wisconsin in Milwaukee, WI (1999), Medical Degree from the University of Minnesota School of Medicine (1996) and has a Bachelor of Science Degree from Marquette University in Milwaukee, WI (1992).
