
Trending increases in extramural awards for 2025




Value of extramural awards




SMPH NIH funding (Blue Ridge #23 in FY24)


Academic year clinical productivity

(FY'25 vs. FY'24)







SMPH Expenditures by Source of Fund – All Missions








Clinical Activity Increasing Year over Year



Dollar Value of Extramural Awards


